

**Riverwood CDD
Environmental Committee Minutes
October 5, 2017**

The meeting was called to order at 10 AM. Present were committee members: Larry Lancette, Ron Sienkowski, Mike Voigt, Jill Rowan, and RCDD Board liaison Mike Spillane.

Minutes from the June 8, 2017 continuation meeting were approved.

1. Homeowners were present from 3171 Osprey (property #57). The committee reviewed the decision from the CDD Board lawyer, related to the homeowners' request for pond bank stabilization, in which the CDD's decision to take no action to stabilize pond banks to prevent further erosion was supported. Discussion among the committee with input from residents followed. A motion was made that the committee recommend to the CDD that they reconsider their decision related to stormwater pond erosion and stabilization based on paragraph 2 of the attached Exhibit A document on RCDD responsibilities related to our storm water control system, and consider reviewing action for property 57 in Osprey Landing. The motion was seconded and approved by unanimous consent.
2. A request from Bay Ridge homeowners related to eliminating bull rush from the pond behind the homes was considered. Based on field surveys from our Severn Trent environmentalist it was determined that these plants are not in a littoral area and may be removed by homeowners. A motion was made to grant permission for the request, it was seconded, and passed by unanimous consent.
3. The committee reviewed and discussed Lake 37 surveys and field visits from Spring of 2017. The homeowner was not present for discussion based on their request. This topic was tabled.
4. Lee Freeman's name was put forward as a possible committee member. A motion was put forward to accept him as an environmental committee member, it was seconded, and approved.
5. The budget for the coming year, 2018, as approved by the RCCD Board, was reviewed. Plans to maintain some of the larger preserves were discussed, including a return to controlled burns. This discussion will be continued later.

The meeting was adjourned at 12 noon.

RCDD ERP OPERATIONS & MAINTENANCE SPECIFIC CONDITIONS SUMMARY May, 2013

The following is a summary of the storm / surface water management system perpetual operations and maintenance general and specific requirements outlined in the Southwest Florida Water Management District Environmental Resources Permits for the Riverwood Community Development District.

I. GENERAL CONDITIONS

1. The permittee is hereby placed on notice that the District will review this permit application periodically and may initiate enforcement action for any violation of the "Permit Conditions" by the permittee, its agents, employees, servants, or representatives.
2. This permit does not relieve the permittee from liability for harm or injury to human health or welfare, animal, plant, or aquatic life or property or penalties therefore caused by the operation of the permitted system, nor does it allow the permittee to cause pollution in contravention of Florida Statutes and District and Department of Environmental Regulation rules.
3. The permittee shall at all times properly operate and maintain the system of treatment and control (and related appurtenances) that are installed or used by the permittee to achieve compliance with conditions of this permit as required by district rules.
4. The permittee, by accepting this permit, specifically agrees to allow authorized District personnel access to the premises for the purpose of inspection and testing to determine compliance with this permit and District regulation.
5. A copy of this permit shall and set of construction drawings depicting the permitted system are required to be kept at the work site of the permitted activity for the entire period of operation.
6. If for any reason the permittee does not comply with, or will be unable to comply with, any condition or limitation specified in this permit, the permittee shall immediately notify and provide the district with a description of and cause of non-compliance and the period of non-compliance, including exact dates and times; or, if not corrected, the anticipated time the non-compliance is expected to continue and steps being taken to reduce eliminate and prevent recurrence it off the non compliance.
7. All rights-of-way and easement locations necessary to operate and maintain all facilities including uplands conservation / buffer areas and wetlands, which constitute the permitted surface water management system shall be reserved for water management purposes.
8. Establishment and survival of littoral areas provided for stormwater quality treatment in wet detention systems shall be assured by proper and continuing maintenance procedures designed to promote viable wetlands plant growth of natural diversity and character.
9. The discharges from this system shall meet state water quality standards as set forth in Chapter 17-3 and rule 17-4.242 for class waters equivalent to the receiving waters.
